
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


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The KARO SWEATER is a classic raglan-style sweater featuring slip-stitch colourwork stripes that mimic a woven texture. The distinct colourwork pattern, evocative of squared paper, reminds us of school days spent colouring in the little squares during idle moments. This playful engagement with 'Karo(papier)' - a colloquial German term for squared paper - not only inspired the sweater's name but also mirrors the whimsical joy found in the simplicity of its design.

Intended ease

Please choose a size 12-20 cm/ 4.75-7.75 in larger than your actual chest circumference. For the best results, please view the table and schematic (pages 6 and 7) to review the measurements at other body points. With greater discrepancies in upper chest and full chest measurements, I recommend going with the upper chest measurement. The sample in the photos is size 2 with 16 cm/ 6.25 in positive ease.

Gauge

The gauge in pattern is 18 sts and 21 MC rnds/rows per 10 cm/4 in (see page 8), worked with a 4.0 mm (US 6) needle, after blocking.

Needles

3.5 mm (US 4) and 4.0 mm (US 6) 60-120 cm/24-47 in circular needles and/or DPNs.

• It's best to use metal needles because they make it easier to slip the stitches. If you're having trouble slipping the stitches comfortably, consider using a smaller needle size for the non-working needle.

Notions

Stitch markers, stitch holders, a darning needle for weaving in ends, measuring tape, scissors.

Yarn requirements Page 4/24

Yarn (Fingering + Lace, DK)

Wooldreamers - Manchelopis (unspun yarn, comes double stranded in plates of 100g = 230m/460m | approx. 250/505 yds): 'Blanco Natural' (MC) held single stranded together with a single strand of Filcolana - Tilia (30% mulberry silk and 70% kid mohair, 25g = 210m | approx. 230 yds) in '101 - Natural White' as the main colour. Wooldreamers - Manchelopis in colourways 'Caldero' (CC1), 'Verde Botella' (CC2) and 'Lavanda' (CC3) held double stranded as contrast colours.


Yarn Substitutes (Fingering + Lace, DK/Worsted)

Wooldreamers - Saona (50% Andalusian Cotton, 50% Merino Entrefino and Manchego wool, $50g = 220m \mid approx. 240 \text{ yds}$) in 'Groen' (MC) held together with Knitting for Olive Silk Mohair (70% Mohair, 30% Silk, $25g = 225m \mid approx. 245 \text{ yds}$) in 'Dusty Artichoke' as the main colour. Wooldreamers - Mota (100% Merino Entrefino and Manchego wool, $100g = 230m \mid approx. 250 \text{ yds}$) in 'Blanco Natural' as contrast colour.




